COUNCIL UPDATE

The Committee have assisted the Council by showing 11 prospective tenants around their new plots over the winter. If you meet a new neighbour we hope that you can welcome them personally to Bushy Park by introducing yourself.

The Council have advised that there are 187 names on the waiting list for Bushy Park so there is still considerable interest for plots.

The removal of the refuse bins has been successful. To date we have not had any rubbish dumped near the gates, thank you for your cooperation.

The water has been turned back on and the Council have attended to the initial leaks that seem to be the legacy of our new water system. John Whitby has been instrumental in solving these issues and will continue to monitor them.

ORGANIC GARDENING


If you are trying to work your allotment organically then you will have a problem with slugs and snails. If you have not come across them the following products are suitable for targeting these annoying pests!

GrowAid Slug Gone These non-toxic pellets are made from concentrated sheep's wool which irritates the slugs when they slide over it and are suitable for organic gardening.

Vitax Slug Death A ready-to-use pelleted bait suitable for organic gardening. After consuming slugs stop feeding and expire discreetly!

Advanced Slug Killer Spray based on Ferramol and certified for organic use. Safe to use around children, pets and wildlife.

It has been a great year for the slug population. Fortunately the toads and frogs seem to have been able to expand their population as well. However I have yet to see one of the latter eating a slug. They just seem to co-hablt dark and damp spots!
